#### **GEMS Parent Survey - November 2021**

At the start of November, you will receive a link to the GEMS parent satisfaction survey for November. We have listened to your feedback from the last survey, and of course will continue to do so. We also love to hear about the things you are happy with at the school, as we have received positive comments from many of you on our social media pages, during face-to-face conversations, and during our webinars. We would be extremely grateful if you could take the time to complete the survey once it is released. The parent survey scoring system works as follows:

	Detractor: score of 0-6. This means you are unhappy
<u>:</u>	Passive: score of 7-8. This means you are satisfied
<b></b>	Promotor: score of 9-10. This means you are happy

Please make sure that you are balanced with your response, you may be unhappy with one particular area, but happy with the school overall. We would appreciate if this is reflected in your submission. If you are a new parent to the school, please could you assign us a score based on your experience so far. We hope that your son/daughter had a smooth transition into the school and felt supported.

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
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### Student inauguration and student voice
