

Purpose

To provide additional opportunities for increased school safety, encourage our students to experience a greater sense of school identity and belonging, to encourage an improvement in student behavior, and to improve and expand academic excellence. The wearing of a uniform removes opportunities for peer pressure and bullying. All students are dressed to the same professional standard.

Aims

To have high expectations and standards for our young people. We encourage a professional environment, preparing our young people for the world of work and employability. We do not believe that 'fashion' or 'trends' should influence the school uniform. We promote professional conduct and presentation from students at all times.

Scope

This policy will be used by all staff in conjunction with the School's Behaviour Policy and will apply rewards and sanctions regarding uniform to all students regardless of age and ability. The reporting of ongoing uniform issues by staff will require liaison with the Head of Year who will act to resolve the issues and issue further sanctions as necessary. The Headteachers and Principal will be the final arbiter and students not conforming to the regulation uniform and not willing to resolve any issues will be sent home to change or will be isolated within school.

Responsibility

Students and the wearing of the School Uniform correctly is the responsibility of all members of the school community – students, parents and staff. The wearing of school uniform is an essential requirement and should be worn to and from school as well as in and around school. We expect the full support of parents in maintaining a high standard of dress and presentation.

Stakeholder Commitment

Staff	Staff will:		
	 Regularly remind students of the School uniform rules and expectations in assemblies, form LEAD time and in lessons 		
	 Recognise and praise efforts made by students who wear their uniform correctly using achievement/house points Act as positive role model for students 		
	 Be approachable, responsive and alert to any problems at home that could cause difficulties with uniform 		
	 Recognise, correct and issue sanctions for the incorrect wearing of the School Uniform in line with the School's Behaviour Policy. 		
Students	Students will:		
	 Wear the correct items of clothing as stated in the School's Uniform Policy Wear the School's uniform correctly, including tucked in shirts for Y3-Y6 and Y10-Y13 Wear the appropriate footwear as stated in the School's Uniform Policy Where appropriate draw attention to issues and requests for possible changes to the uniform rules and expectations via the student council. 		





Parents	Parents will:
	 Give their full support in maintaining a high standard of dress and presentation and the correct wearing of school uniform to and from school
	 Alert the student's LEAD teacher or Head of Year if a child has difficulty meeting the School Uniform requirements
	 Provide medical information or a letter from the doctor if there are any medical reasons why the wearing of the School Uniform is difficult/needs modifying
	 Provide students with the correct items of clothing for their School Uniform and restrict them from buying incorrect or inappropriate items.
	 Help their child to maintain a clean and tidy appearance with their uniform and personal hygiene.

Purchasing and Replacing School Uniform

The school is divided in four divisions, each with its own unique uniform:

FOREST SCHOOL: Foundation Stage to Year 2

VALUES SCHOOL: Year 3 to Year 6
ACTIVE SCHOOL: Year 7 to Year 9
FUTURE SCHOOL: Year 10 to Year 13

As our school uniforms is available from THREADS The Uniform Store https://www.threadsme.com , please note that the uniform should only be procured from THREADS to ensure uniformity of style and fabric. Substitutes are not acceptable.

Please ensure that all clothing and equipment is clearly marked with the student's name and form group. It is the students and parents' responsibility that the student is in full school uniform every day they are in school.

If the uniform gets damaged or discoloured, we request that a replacement be purchased at the earliest. Students must be aware that our expectations are the same when they are wearing the Metropole uniform outside of school. We request the parents to support their child meeting the above expectations.

Uniform Expectations

The uniform must be worn correctly:

- On arrival at school
- When travelling home from school
- Whilst at school
- When exiting the play areas at the end of break and/or lunchtime

Items and actions not allowed

- Hems of skirts taken up or rolled up at the waist
- Trainers; Canvas shoes; Trainers; Patterned Shoes; Heels
- Coloured makeup or any makeup that is immediately noticeable (no make-up allowed at all in the Prep School)
- Nail varnish





- Facial piercings other than the ears: Students are permitted to wear one small stud earring in each
 ear. No other piercings are permitted. Jewellery items of religious significance may only be worn
 with prior approval from the Head of Year, following a formal written parental request
- Students in the Values School should not dye their hair any bright colours.
- Wrist and ankle bracelets
- Necklaces
- · Tattoos of any kind

Shoes

- Shoes should be black leather school shoes
- Shoes should have no coloured soles or logos. Shoes should be polished regularly
- Any types of sports shoes (even if they are fully black) are unacceptable (other than for PE)
- Laced VAN type shoes are unacceptable also
- Please do not purchase shoes that will prohibit your child from being in lessons

Consequences

The School's Behaviour Policy will be adhered to for situations where school uniform is inappropriate. If a student fails to meet the school uniform requirements, the student will be requested to amend this with immediate effect; if this is not possible, they will be required to remain at home until such time as they can meet the school's expectations. Students will not be allowed in lessons if they are not in full school uniform. It is the school's decision on what constitutes 'appropriate' uniform.
