Year 6 - Term 1A



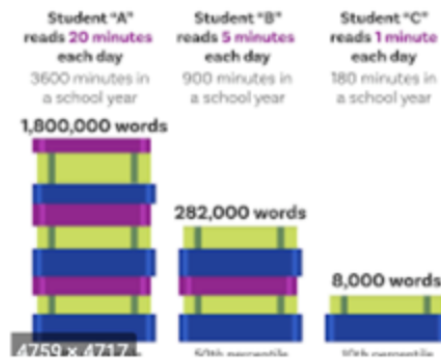
Arabic

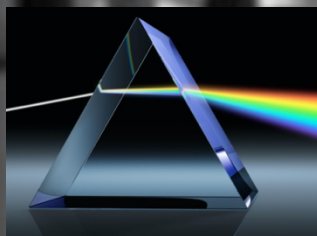

English

During English this half term, Year six will be exploring poetry and newspaper through the context of our Crime and Punishment topic. Students will be able to research, plan and write a newspaper as well as explore a variety of poetry.

Topic

Our first topic this year is 'Crime and Punishment'.

We will be comparing various historical periods and their outlook on crime and the punishments used at the time, from Roman times all the way up to the present. Some of the time periods covered include the Romans, Vikings and Tudors and analysed the crimes in the time periods and how they were used.

PE

For netball the students will be applying fitness to the game such as power and strength. Choose and implement arrange of strategies to play offensively and defensively. Grasp more technical aspects of the game. Focus to be paid to leadership and communication skills.

Art

Year 6 will be introduced to Banksy and gather prior knowledge on the artist. They will gain a greater understanding of his work, and start to experiment using the techniques by the artist. They will use his work as inspiration to create some Banksy art work.

Moral Education

Our half termly focus is 'Character and Morality'. During this unit of work, the children will explain the meaning of moral values and how they perceive ethical dilemma.

Spanish

The children will have an introduction into the language and begin with greetings and talking about themselves.

Social Studies

In Social Studies, the children will be learning about ancient civilisations and their impact on the world we live in today.

French

The children will be building on their basic French language patterns, by practising how to greet people, and how to introduce and discuss a little about themselves.
