

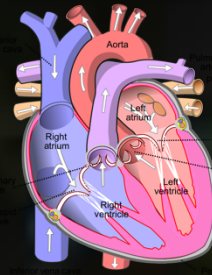
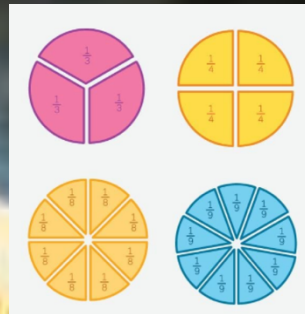


Does Every Crime Deserve a Punishment?

Maths

The half term is all about fractions: adding and subtracting with different denominators; multiplying and dividing fractions and ordering/comparing fractions. It is important that students know their times tables well and can recall the facts accurately.



Science

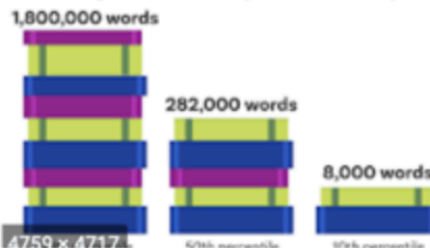
In science, we will be extending our knowledge of the human body. We will specifically learn about the cardiovascular system, with a particular focus on the heart. Our working scientifically skills will focus on designing, implementing and reflecting on an investigation.

English

The focus this half term is on writing a persuasive argument. The context will be crimes and punishments that have taken place in traditional fairy tales. After this genre, we will write our 'twisted' fairy tale as we build upon our knowledge of writing narratives.

Topic

The focus this half term will be on Modern History, through the lens of Crime and Punishment. We will delve into the Victorian Period and the laws that were implemented at this time in the UK. The topic will end with a look at our future: what will crimes and punishments look like for the next generation and why do you think that?

PE

This half term we will be focusing on escape and capture games to build agility and strategic thinking. We will play a variety of games to build these skills, including Mission Secret Agent! Can you think strategically to avoid capture and free your team mates?

Spanish

Building upon our basic skills, the focus will be on colours and numbers.

Moral, Social and Cultural Studies

Our focus will be on responsibility for ourselves, others and the environment. We will look at ways to show responsibility, build the capacity further and how we can be agents of change to support other people and our environment.

Art

Year 6 will be introduced to Banksy and gather prior knowledge on the artist. They will gain a greater understanding of his work, and start to experiment using the techniques by the artist. They will use his work as inspiration to create some Banksy art work.

Computer Science

In our CS lessons, we will be developing our understanding of internet safety and how to appropriately communicate online.

Students will be studying the topics 'Happy Birthday' and 'In My Bag' as they progress through the French curriculum.
