Maths

In maths next term, we will be looking at area, perimeter and volume. Students will be discovering how to calculate the perimeter, area and volume of a variety of 2D and 3D shapes, using different strategies such as estimation and specific formula. Students will also look at statistics, focusing on how to read an interpret line graphs and pie charts, as well as locating the mean.

English

During English this half term, Year six will be exploring a non-fiction book called 'Pale'. Students will read and analyse the story, identifying a variety of features used and work to implement these in their own writing. Students will also focus on revising the SPaG concepts which they have learned throughout Key Stage 2.

Arabic B

The students will be learning how to write a report on their healthy habits following a sequence. They will formulate a dialogue with a person who has a healthy lifestyle in which they highlight their lifestyle and ask for advice. The students will also be writing about the different aspects of how a person takes care of himself. They will be learning how to use negative command form and discuss subjects related to food and health.

Science

In term 3, children will learn how to classify living things through the major classification kingdoms, defined by Carl Linnaeus. They will observe microorganisms, plants and animals by comparing their similarities and differences. They will also consolidate their learning in preparation for progress tests, and develop their scientific working skills.

Topic

Our topic will explore many fascinating individuals who dare to be different: we will look at the struggles they have faced, their achievements and the legacy they have left behind. Can you name anyone who is inspirational because they have dared to be different?

PE

Year 6 students will continue to explore a range of activities in P.E. lessons, which alternate on a weekly basis.

Students will focus on a variety of sports such as football, Table tennis, netball and gymnastics. They will also explore a range of skills such as striking and fielding and leadership throughout the term.

Moral, Social and Cultural Studies

In Term 3A, Year 6 students will be learning about the Global Age of Islamic Civilisation, focusing on how innovation, art, architecture and medicine were influenced by Scholars in Baghdad.

Art

This term students will be looking at the themes of patterns and will explore a variety of artists to use as inspiration. Students will gather knowledge on Kandinsky and Matisse and will be encouraged to use a wide range of mix mediums such as watercolours, oil pastels and chalk.

Year 6 will also look at geometric and organic shapes in more detail, and this will help them develop their outcomes.

Performing Arts

In Performing Arts, students will study Trash by Andy Mulligan. Students will be encouraged to explore voice/accent and characterisation. Students will also learn the origins of ballad singing, exploring empowering songs and contemporary dances linked to the class topic.

French and Spanish

In term 3A, Year 6 French students will start by recapping previously taught sentence structures, but will then start to study the topic of 'holidays'. This topic focuses on key vocabulary and the verb 'aller' (to go) in French. Towards the end of the topic, students will also look at clothes, for example what they might wear when they go on holiday.
